# **Monthly Topic and Speaker**

This month's topic:

### The trend in the design of transportable air traffic control systems and data centers and the issues that face the design engineer

Tim Dugan graduated Summa cum Laude with a BSEE from the University of New Haven. Tim is currently a Principal Engineer for ARINC, North Charleston and designs transportable air traffic control systems and data centers. He was an equity partner in a joint venture with Corning to manufacture coaxial cable for the cable television industry in Summerville. He has published over 100 technical papers and application notes to address the needs of the telecommunication industry.

The transportable systems that he currently designs are fabricated using one to fifteen standard high cube 20 foot and 40 foot ISO shipping containers which are then deployed all over the world. Walls, ceilings, floors, lighting, HVAC etc... limits the already tight spaces. Over the recent past the power density of the electronic equipment inside the racks has increased substantially. The need for higher voltages and more cooling has presented additional issues.
